

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Introductions

Introduction to the {Z} group of Audley Families.

This Branch of the Audley Family (Audley Family ZA) is one of a series of 4 Audley Family Trees. The relationship between these families is shown in the following diagram.



- The Audley Family ZT family tree (this document) contains the Family Tree of those people with the Touchet surname, including many variant spellings, prior to the Touchet family becoming Baron Lord Audley of Heleigh in 1405. The file stops with the marriage of {ZT18} Sir John Touchet to {ZA14} Joan de Aldithley. The combined Touchet/ Audley family Tree is continued in Audley Family ZC. This document contains the details of approximately 43 individuals.
- The Audley Family ZA family tree contains the Family History of those individuals with the Audley surname, including many variant spellings that became Barons, Lord Audley of Heleigh in County Staffordshire. Other members of this family became Barons of Stratton Audley; and Earl of Gloucester. One Member of this family Sir James Audley was the hero of the Battle of Poitiers (19th September 1356) and was a founder member of the Order of the Garter. The line of Audley's holding the title of Baron Audley of Heleigh ceased on the 23rd July 1391 with the Death of {ZA16} Nicholas de Aldithley. His Sister {ZA14} Joan de Aldithley had married {ZT18} Sir John Touchet and their grandson {ZC2} Sir John Touchet became Baron Audley of Heleigh on the 21st December 1405. The line of the Barons Audley of Stratton Audley only survived for a single generation and from 1321 to 1326. Similarly the line of an Audley being Earl of Gloucestershire only survived for a single Generation and from 1337 to 1347. This document contains the details of approximately 61 individuals

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- The Audley Family ZC family tree contains the family tree of those people holding the title Baron Lord Audley from 1405 to 1997, when the 25th Lord Audley of Heleigh died and the title went into 'Abeyance' Within this Family Tree the surname of the person holding the title changes from Touchet to Thickness, to Jesson and finally Souter. The file commences with the marriage of {ZT18} Sir John Touchet to {ZA14} Joan de Aldithley. and terminated with the death of {ZC97} Richard Michael Thomas Souter in 1997. This document contains the details of approximately 120 individuals.
- The Audley Family ZW family tree contains the family to the Baron Audley of County Essex, England. This Barony was only in existence for one generation and limited to the period 1538 to 1544. Whilst the title was held by one person he was Lord Chancellor of England for the 11 years prior to his death and was elected a member of the Knights of the Garter. Despite only one person holding the title the Audley ZW document contains details of 50 individuals
- Other Audley Families such as Audley Family T & Audley Family N may be related to the above families but as yet the relationship has not been identified..

Origin of this branch of the Audley Family Tree

The earliest members of Audley Family ZA were probably born in the late 1100s. It is uncertain whether the Touchet family came over with William the Conqueror as the surname appears in the 'Battle Abbey Rolls' or whether like the Audley's were Anglo Saxon and supported the Norman Overlords.

However in France there was a commune in the Manche department of Normandy called Notre-Dame-du-Touchet (according to Wikipedia) that was merged into the new commune of Mortain-Bocage on 1st January 2016. (See the map below.)



This would lead us to conclude that the Touchet's probably entered England with William the Conqueror. (No similar location has been identified in France that can be associated with the Audley surname.)

Key Dates for the Baron's Audley

- Pre 1312/13 GEC in his The Complete Peerage refers to the ancestors of {ZA12} Nicholas de Aldithley as 'may have been feudal Baron's.
- 1312/1313 {ZA12} NICHOLAS DE ALDITHLEY becomes LORD AUDLEY (ref The Complete Peerage Vol 1 page 339) In the write up in this family tree file we also accredit him as being the 1st Lord Audley of Heleigh.
- 1321 {ZA23} HUGH DE ALDITHLEY became BARON AUDLEY OF STRATTON AUDLEY, CO OXFORDSHIRE.
- 1336/7 {ZA24} HUGH DE ALDITHLEY became EARL OF GLOUCESTER in 1337, through his Marriage to Margaret de Clare. The title appears to have become extinct upon his Death in 1347 (It should be noted that {ZA24} Hugh de Aldithley never held the title nor was he in line to hold the title LORD AUDLEY.) (This short line is discussed in The Complete Peerage Vol 1 page 346)
- 1391 {ZA16} NICHOLAS DE ALDITHLEY 3rd LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH, Dies without issue. Nicholas' Sister {ZA14} Joan de Aldithley had Married Sir John Touchet. Their Grand Son {ZC2} SIR JOHN TOUCHET KNIGHT becomes the 4th LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH.
- 1405 {ZC2} SIR JOHN TOUCHET KNIGHT becomes the 4th LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH.
- 1538 {ZW5} THOMAS AUDLEY becomes first and last BARON AUDLEY OF WALDEN. There is no evidence to link the members of this branch of the Barons Audley to any other branch of the Barons Audley. In fact the Coat of Arms of Barons Audley of Walden is completely different from all other branches of the Barons Audley.
- 1544 {ZW5} THOMAS AUDLEY 1st BARON AUDLEY OF WALDEN dies and the barony becomes 'extinct'
- 1616 {ZC20} GEORGE TOUCHET; 11th LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH in addition to the title Lord Audley became 1ST BARON AUDLEY OF ORIER in COUNTY ARMAGH, IRELAND and 1ST EARL OF CASTLEHAVEN in COUNTY CORK, IRELAND.
- 1633 {ZC22} JAMES TOUCHET 13th LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH, 3rd EARL OF CASTLEHAVEN & 3rd BARON AUDLEY OF ORIER became 1st BARON AUDLEY OF HELY. (See The Complete Peerage Vol 1 page 346, for the difference between the Barons Audley of Heleigh and Barons Audley of Hely.)
- The EARLDOM OF CASTLEHAVEN in County Cork, Ireland, & the BARONY OF ORIER in County Armagh, Ireland both becomes extinct upon the Death of {ZC69} JOHN TALBOT TOUCHET (18TH LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH), and 8TH BARON AUDLEY OF ORIER, CO ARMAGH, IRELAND, & 8th EARL OF CASTLEHAVEN, (The Viscountcy 'Carhampton of Castlehaven' in County Cork,

Ireland, was created in 1781 and became extinct in 1829, this Viscountcy has nothing to do with the Audley Family)

- 1777 {ZC70} GEORGE THICKNESSE becomes the 19th LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH. He is the second son of {ZC28} ELIZABETH TOUCHET (the sister of {ZC69} BARON JOHN TALBOT TOUCHET) & her husband CAPTAIN PHILIP THICKNESSE Esq
- 1784 {ZC70} GEORGE THICKNESSE (LORD AUDLEY) changes his surname to THICKNESSE-TOUCHET.
- 1872 {ZC72} GEORGE EDWARD THICKNESSE-TOUCHET 21st LORD AUDLEY OF HELEIGH. Died in 1872, and according to "GEC" in The Complete Peerage of the Barony (i.e the title Lord Audley) fell into abeyance (ref The Complete Peerage Vol 1 page 346)
- 1937 {ZC73} MARY THICKNESSE-TOUCHET becomes 22nd 'Baroness Audley' of Heleigh, following the Death of {ZC74} her younger Sister, EMILY THICKNESSE TOUCHET on the 17th May 1937.
- Following the Death of {ZC73} on the 27th May 1942 the title of 'Lord Audley' is inherited by the Jesson (Touchet- Jesson) family by, {ZC96} THOMAS PERCY HENRY TOUCHET JESSON becoming the 23rd Baron Audley of Heleigh.
- Following the death of {ZC95} ROSINA LOIS VERONICA TUCHET JESSON (sic), 24th Baroness Audley of Heleigh, on the 24th October 1973, the title of ' Lord Audley' is inherited by the Souter family.
- Following the death of {ZC97} RICHARD MICHAEL THOMAS SOUTER 25th Lord Audley of Heleigh, on the 27th June 1997, the title of 'LORD AUDLEY' went into 'Abeyance'.


Summary Tree


In defining the Touchet Line prior to the Touchet family becoming 'Lord Audley' the following basis has been used:

- For the direct family line between {ZT11} (Sir) Thomas Tuchet born 1244 and {ZT18} John Tuchet born 1327 who married Joan Audley; consisting of (4 generations) most published documents (The Complete Peerage published in 1958; The family tree produced for the first Earl of Castlehaven and Published in The Genealogist in 1880; Collins Peerage 2nd Edition published in 1820; Baronagium Genealogicum published 1764 to 1784; Ormerod's Cheshire published in 1884) have the same lineage and that lineage has been used in producing this document section.
- Prior to the Birth of {ZT11} (Sir) Thomas Tuchet Born 1244 all the above publications differ from each other. Therefore prior to 1244 the direct family line, in this document has been based on The Complete Peerage published in 1958. This document has been selected as it is the latest document published and give the most references as to the sources of its information
- Both the Ormerod Touchet Family Tree and that produced for the 1st Earl of Castlehaven indicate that {ZT13} Robert Touchet had 2 Sons {ZT14} Thomas Touchet & {ZT15} Sir Robert Touchet. {ZT14} Sir Thomas Touchet is part of the branch of the Touchet family that eventually became 'Lord Audley and is therefore included in The Complete Peerage whereas {ZT15} is not. This write up therefore includes {ZT15} and his subsequent branch of the tree is based on Ormerod's work and includes comments from the tree produced for the 1st Earl of Castlehaven.

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Detailed Narrative

In defining the Touchet Line prior to the Touchet family becoming 'Lord Audley' the following basis has been used:

- For the direct family line between {ZT11} (Sir) Thomas Tuchet, Born in 1244 and {ZT18} John Tuchet, Born in 1327 who Married to {ZA14} Joan Audley; consisting of (4 generations) most published documents. (The Complete Peerage published in 1958; The family tree produced for the 1st Earl of Castlehaven and Published in The Genealogist in 1880; Collins Peerage 2nd Edition published in 1820; Baronagium Genealogicum published 1764 to 1784; Ormerod's Cheshire published in 1884) have the same lineage, and that stated lineage has been used in producing this document section.
- Prior to the Birth of {ZT11} (Sir) Thomas Tuchet, Born 1244 all the above publications differ from each other. Therefore prior to 1244 the direct family line, in this document has been based on The Complete Peerage published in 1958. This document has been selected as it is the latest document published and give the most references as to the sources of its information

{ZT3} **JOSCELIN TUCHET** held of the Earl of Chester in 1086 the Manors of Ashwell Rutland, and Mackworth, Co Derby of which the Tuchet's were tenants in the 13th and 14th Centuries. (Source: Complete Peerage, Edition 2 volume 12 part 2.)

- 1. {ZT16} **HENRY TUCHET** Son and Heir was circa 1124-29 Lord of Long Clawson, County Leicester, and a man of this name granted, in the reign of Henry I a tithe of his Demesne (*Comment; Demesne is a piece of land attached to a Manor and retained by the owner for their own use*) at Hose, near Long Clawson, to the Abbey of Belvoir, County Leicester. He was also benefactor of Darley Abbey, County Derby. He died sometime before 1143-1149. (*Source: Complete Peerage, Edition 2 volume 12 part 2.*)
 - a.) {ZT17} **HENRY TUCHET** Son and Heir in 1143-49, was confirmed in the possession of all his lands by the Earl of Chester. Before 1156 he granted a virgate of land in Ashwell to the Abbey of St Mary de Pré (or de Paris), Leicester; and in 1166 was fined 41 (4 livres 4 pound) in County Derby. He was also a benefactor of Darley Abbey (as was his Father) He married MAUD ???? and he Died in 1178. Maud survived him (Source: Complete Peerage Edition 2 volume 12 part 2.)
 - {ZT5} SIMON TOUCHET Son and Heir was fined 1m. (Comment: fined 1 Mark; A Mark was a A) unit of account [currency] introduced by the Danes in the time of King Alfred and still in use at this time) in Nottinghamshire in 1178. In 1187, when the Honor of Chester was in the King's hands, Simon collected 'Scutage' (Comment: In feudal society Scutage is money paid by a Vassal to his Lord in lieu of military service) and other monies due to the Crown therefrom, being for his service he was excused his own Scutage of 60s, from that Honor. He also answered for the rent of Tackley, Co Oxford, and was custodian of the lands of Robert FitzNeel, a tenant of the Honor in that year. At some time within the years 1188 to 1197. Abbot Nicholas of Burton Abbey confirmed him in the tenure of the Abbey's Manor of Willington, Co Derby, which John de Cumbrai had granted to Simon. He witnessed a charter of Richard de Curzon concerning Kedleston Co Derby, and 'Essoined' (Comment: An excuse for not appearing in Court himself at the Lichfield Assizes in 1203.) Simon was a benefactor of Darley Abbey as was his Father. He married PERNEL (Petronella) de CUMBRAI probably daughter of Roger de Cumbrai and Co-Heir of another Roger of that name. He appears to have Died circa 1203-05 His Widow was living in 1218. (Source: Complete Peerage Edition 2 volume 12 part 2.)
 - i) {ZT7} **THOMAS TOUCHET** Son and Heir appeared in 1205 as a tenant of the Earl of Chester and was in control of Ashwell in 1209. He was a Commissioner to survey the forest in Derbyshire in 1219, a collector of the Fifteenth (Comment; the 'Fifteenth' was a tax levied on goods, the tax to be paid being one fifteenth of the value of the goods) in Counties Nottingham and Derby in 1225 a Justice of 'novel disseisin' and Jail delivery in

the same Counties in 1227, 1228 and 1229 and a Commissioner of Array in Co Derby in 1230. About 1218 he presented to the living of Ashwell Church, he made a gift of lands to Wombridge Priory, Salop, 1215-24, and was in litigation with the Abbot of Burton in 1224 and 1226. He appears in 1221, as Lord of Lee Gomery, Salop, which he probably inherited from his Mother Pernel (Petronella) de Cumbrai. He Married ELIZABETH ???? and Died before 2nd January 1234/5. Elizabeth was living in 1245, when she presented to Ashwell Church and she was probably still living in Sept 1248. (Source: Complete Peerage Edition 2 volume 12 part 2.)

- **I) {ZT19} HENRY TUCHET** Son and Heir did homage for his Father's lands shortly before the 2nd January 1234/5. He may be the Henry Tuchet who with *(possibly his Ist Wife BASILEA ????,)* entered into an agreement with the Abbot of Burton in 1226. If this is so, Baselia must have Died before the end of 1241, for at Henry's Death his Wife was **{ZA33}** EMMA de ALDITHLEY *(AUDLEY)*, Daughter of **{ZA5}** Henry de Audley *(or Aldithley of Heleigh)* Staffordshire, and by Bertred daughter of Ralph Mainwaring Steward of Chester. He died without issue shortly before the 8th January 1241/2. His Wife married 2nd to Gruffudd ap Madog II, who died 7th December 1269, and 3rd to William of Worcester. She was living Feb 1264/5. *(Source: Complete Peerage Edition 2 volume 12 part 2.)*
- II) {ZT9} SIR ROBERT TOUCHET Brother and Heir paid 10m relief (Comment: paid 10 Mark relief; A Mark was a unit of account[currency] introduced by the Danes in the time of King Alfred and still in use at this time) on 20th November 1242 to obtain his inheritance and was granted respite of Knighthood in 1244. He Married Alice and died 13th October 1248. Alice survived him.(Source: Complete Peerage Edition 2 Volume 12 part 2.)
 - a.) {ZT11} (SIR) THOMAS TOUCHET Son and Heir, Born in 1244 was a ward of John Mansell. He witnessed a deed in the Law Courts at Derby 1281; claimed in 1285/6 view of frank pledge and waif in Ashwell; and was Commissioner of Peace in County of Derby, 1287. The King summoned him for Foreign Service in 1297, and against the Scots, 1301 and 1314; and on the 16th September (1297) 25 Ed I, he was summoned to a Military Council, which was to meet in London on the 6th October. Thomas made grants to Wombridge Priory circa 1269. He Married MARGERY ????, and had issue. He Died shortly before 1st May 1315. (Source: Complete Peerage Edition 2 volume 12 part 2.)
 - i) {ZT13} ROBERT TOUCHET (continued below)

i) {ZT13} **SIR ROBERT TOUCHET** (continued from above)

'The Complete Peerage' by G.E.Cokayne, states 'Robert Tuchet, Son and Heir, probably Born at Christmas 1264 was given seisin of his Father's lands on the 13th June 1315. He was summoned against the Scots in 1316 and 1322 during the Wars of Scottish Independence; was appointed on the 4th July 1323, 'Keeper of the Soke', and Castle of Melbourne, Co Derby; and in March 1324 was 'Keeper' of forfeited lands in the same County. On the 9th May (1324) 17 Edw II he was summoned to a Great Council, which was to meet at Westminster on the 30th May in the same year. He married 1st AGNES ????? and 2nd JOAN DUTTON. He died probably before December 1341. Joan survived him.'

'Collins Peerage of England' by Arthur Collins states, 'Sir Robert Touchet, Knight. Who in (8 Edw I) (1279-1280) doing his homage, had livery of his lands. And in (13 Edw II) (1319 -1320) was one of those Barons, who, with the Earls of Lancaster and Hereford, assembled together at Sherborne, in Elmedone, and swore to stand by each other, until they had amended the state of the realm. But, notwithstanding the said oath, this ROBERT, LORD TOUCHET, and many of the rest, submitted themselves to the King. (Comment: There are

significant differences between various recorded sources particularly in the date of Birth of {ZT13}. The 'Complete Peerage' gives a date of Birth as Christmas 1264. This is based in his age stated in his Father's inquest in 1315 which states that Robert Audley was aged 50 at Xmas 1314. Although the 'Complete Peerage' states that in different places the same document states that he was aged 40 and more. 'Ormerod' by George Ormerod states that he was aged 40 in (8 Edw II)(8 July 1314 to 7 July 1315). So it looks as though 'Ormerod' and the 'Complete Peerage' appear to be using the same document to estimate his date of Birth and have taken the opposite ends of the range indicated by the source document.)

(Comment: 'The Complete Peerage' states that he was given seisin (feudal possession) of his Father's lands in 13th June 1315. Whereas 'Collins's Peerage of England' states he was doing homage and had livery of his lands in (8 Edw I) (1279- 1280). It is believed 'doing homage and had livery of his lands' has the same meaning as 'given seisin of his Father's lands' And yet these two documents appear to have the same event taking place 35 years apart. Conclude therefore that there is an error in Collin's and records the event as occurring in the reign of the wrong King and should say (8 Edw II) (1314 - 1315) and not (8 Edw I) (1279-1280) If this conclusion is correct then both the Complete Peerage and Collins's Peerage of England would be in agreement.)

- i) {ZT15} SIR ROBERT TOUCHET (Continued below)
- *ii)* {ZT14} **SIR THOMAS TOUCHET** Birth year uncertain,, Son and Heir, of {ZT13} Sir Robert Touchet, by his 1st Wife, Agnes ????. He was ordered in December 1341, to find Archers in Derbyshire for service in *Scotland and France; and in 1342 he was trying to obtain the right of view of frank pledge at Markeaton. He was called upon to supply a Man-at-Arms for Ashwell, but was represented in France during the campaign of 1346-47 by his Son. {ZT18} John. He married a JOAN ????, and He Died on the 18th August 1349.

(Comment: The above information is taken from Complete Peerage Edition 2 Vol 12 Part 2).

(*Comment:- During that period of time there were two wars being fought, whether or not these conflicts played a part in the need for "Archers" is not known. However, these wars might have influenced the reason why the order was given to him. The wars identified were, "The Second War of Scottish Independence", also known as the Anglo-Scottish War, known as The Second War (1332–1357). It was the second cluster of a series of military campaigns fought between the independent Kingdom of Scotland and the Kingdom of England. The other military campaign being fought was "The War of the Breton Succession", this was a conflict for control of the Duchy of Brittany. It was fought between 1341 and the 12th April 1365. This war formed an integral part of the early 'Hundred Years' War due to the involvement of the French and English governments in the conflict.)

1.) {ZT18} **SIR JOHN TOUCHET** Knight (of whom more presently under Aldithley ad Touchet Lines combined) and who married {ZA14} Joan de Aldithley

Continued from above

{ZT15} **SIR ROBERT TOUCHET** (1300 – 1340/3?) Married MATILDA de BROMHALL (???? - ????) and had issue. Birth year is not certain. He was Lord of Buglawton and Nether Whitley, Cheshire. Sir Robert Touchet, in 1319, "was one of the Barons who with the Earls of Lancaster and Hereford, assembled at Sherborne in Elmedon, and swore to stand by each other until they had amended the state of the realm; but notwithstanding this oath, Sir Robert Touchet, with many others, submitted to the King." - Edward II *(The Battle Abbey Roll, Vol 111)*

(Comment: Whilst the above narrative and Ormerod indicate that the Widow of {ZT15} married John Dabridgecourt The Complete Peerage indicates that it was the Widow of {ZC1} that Married to John Dabridgecourt. Discussions as to who really married John Dabridgecourt is contained in 'Appendix D' who married John Dabridgecourt.)

- 1. {ZT23} **THOMAS TOCHET** Lord of Nether Whitley, and in 1355 tenant of the Manor of Buglawton (then in custody of Thomas de Derrington), his right to which, in (1 Hen 4),(1399-1400) he quit-claimed to John Dabridgecourt and {ZC2} John Tochet Knight and Son of {ZT18} John Tochet. Married ELLENA ????, and Married under age, had issue, and Divorced in 1384 (8Ric 2.) (Source: Ormerod.) (Comment: Whilst the above is a transcript from Ormerod 2nd Edition, Vol 1 page 662, there is clearly an error as {ZC2} is the Grandson of {ZT18}. The above should be read in conjunction with 'Appendix C' which discusses the confusion between {ZT18}, {ZC1} & {ZC2} who were all named John Touchet.)
 - A. {ZT24} **JOHN TOCHET** Son of Thomas Tochet, Lord of Nether Whitley ob ante (37 Hen 6). Married ISABEL ????, and had issue, and who married 2nd to William Chorley (Source: Ormerod 2nd Edition, Vol 1 page 662)
 - a. {ZT25} **THOMAS TOCHET** Lord of Nether Whitley, (22 Hen 6), Married to MATILDA DANIEL, Daughter of John Daniel of Daresbury, Cheshire, and had issue. (Source: Ormerod 2nd Edition, Vol 1, page 662)

Appendix "B" Who married John Dabridgecourt?

Whilst the title of this Appendix refers to John Dabridgecourt, research documents viewed spell his surname in different ways, for example D'Abridgecourt and Dabrichecourt.

Conflicting Information

- The pedigree completed for {ZC20} George the 1st Earl of Castlehaven states that {ZT15} Sir Robert Tuchet married Matilda the daughter of Richard de Bromehal *(sic)* and gives a date of *(21 Edw 3)* (1347-1348) It states that Matilda's 2nd Husband was JOHN DABRIDGECOURT. Unfortunately does not give source of information
- Ormerod has {ZT15} Robert Tuchet with dates of (8 Edw 3) (1334-1335) and a possible Death in (15 Edw 3) (1341 1342) as marrying Matilda, Daughter of Richard de Bromhall. Matilda married second SIR JOHN D'ABRIDGECOURT (sic). Unfortunately does not give source of information
- Complete Peerage Vol 12 part 2 has {ZC1} John Touchet. Marrying Maud and dying on the 23rd June 1372, and that Maud married JOHN DABRIDGECOURT before the 31 August 1381. (Source HCS new series Vol X pages 99-100)
- The History of Parliament on line website for SIR JOHN DABRICHECOURT (sic) (Died 1415), of Markeaton, Derbyshire http://www.historyofparliamentonline.org/volume/1386-1421/member/dabrichecourt-sir-john-1415 has: '?Son (sic) of Sir Sir Sanchet Dabrichecourt (sic) (Died circa 1360) KG Brother of Sir Nicholas. Married by September 1378, Maud, Widow of Sir John Tuchet (Died 1371), of Markeaton, 1 Son, 5 Daughters, 2 Sons, Illegitimate, Knighted by October 1375; KG source given as; 20th March 1413. (source JUST 1/1488, rot. 9; Top. et Gen. ed. Nichols, i. 197; Reg. Chichele, ii. 51-54, 108-10; G.F. Beltz, Mems. Order of the Garter, pp. lv, clvii; CPR, 1374-7, p. 180.)

So the two problems to be resolved are

- Was the name of the person who married Sir John Dabridgecourt Maud or Matilda
- Was the person who married Sir John Dabridgecourt the Widow of {ZT15} Sir Robert Touchet or {ZC1} John Touchet.

Conclusions

Based on the information in the 'Discussion Section' below it is concluded that:

- John Dabridgecourt married the Widow of {ZC1} John Touchet and not {ZT15} Sir Robert Touchet
- The Wife of {ZC1} is Maud and the Wife of {ZT 15} is Matilda. The fact that Maud is a vernacular *(commonly spoken)* version of Mathilda could account for why John Darabridgecourt is in some documents incorrectly attributed to have Married the Widow of {ZT15} instead of {ZT35}. This conclusion does not conclude whether the 'De Broomhill should be attributed to the Wife of {ZA15} or {ZT35}.

Discussions

- The Oxford Dictionary of Forenames states that Maud is a medieval vernacular of Matilda. Therefore the same person could be called Mathilda or Maud in the same why that a person could be called Alex or Alexander.
- HCS (Historical Collection of Staffordshire), new series Vol X page 99-100. Covers the Lichfield Episcopal Registers 1381 of Bishop Robert De Stretton, and has the following: (with Tag Reference numbers in red colour)

[Aug 31st.] The Official of the Archdeacon of Derby acknowledges a mandate from the Bishop, dated Heywode, iii Kal. Sept 1381, (presumably 3rd Day of September 1381) ordering him to make an inquisition concerning the presentation of Thomas Touchet to the Church of Makworth (sic) [Mackworth] by John Dabrichourt (sic) and Wife of {ZC1}Matilda his Wife and commissioned him to act accordingly. The Official reports that on Saturday the last day of August, in the Church of St Michael, Derby, in full chapter of the place, by the Rectors and Vicars present in chapter viz dss (sic) [namely ?????] Thomas, Henry and Hugh, Rectors of Braylesford (sic) [Brailsford], Longeley (sic) and Keteleston, (sic) [Kedleston] dss John, John, and John Vicars of Spondon (sic), St Werburga (sic) [Werburgh] and St Michael, Derby, he made inquisition upon all the articles contained in the Bishop's mandate. The inquisition said that the vacancy began on Tuesday after St Bartholomew by the Death of ds John; that the presenters were the true patrons, and {ZT14}Sir John Tuchet father of {ZC1}Sir John Tuchet, the Husband of the said Wife of {ZC1}Matilda, last presented the aforesaids (sic) [?????] John, (presumably it was this John who had Died) who was instituted and inducted; that the presentee was of good life and honest conversation, in Priests' orders and not elsewhere beneficed. The Official accordingly, on the said Saturday, admitted Thomas Touchet, instituted him, and made him to be inducted. Dated Derby vj Kal. Oct.(sic) [6th day of October]

Comments on the above

(Interpretation of the above is that Sir John Touchet and his Wife Matilda, presented a John Touchet to be Vicar of Mackworth and when that the John (*the Vicar*) had died Matilda and her 2nd Husband John Dabridgecourt presented Thomas Touchet to be the next vicar of Mackworth. The date of the Episcopal Registers from Lichfield is 1381; this is some 40 years after the latest date in Ormerod referring to Matilda and John Dabridgecourt.)

Tag numbers can only be fitted into the above source of John Darabridgecourt Married the Widow of {ZC1}.John Touchet.

• A second document from HCS [Historical Collections of Staffordshire] original series Vol XVI pages 87-88 has:

CORAM REGE Trinity 11 H IV 30 September 1409 to 29 September 1410)

Derb. Memorandum that Thomas Beaufort, Knight, the King's Chancellor, delivered into Court by his own hands the record of a suit taken before him at Easter (11 H IV), which was in these words. The King sent a close writ to the Sheriff of co Derby, stating that by virtue of a commission taken before John Fray, and returned into the Chancery, it appeared that {ZC2} John Tuchet, Knight, deceased, was seised in fee simple of the reversion of the Manor of Marton, after the Death of his Mother, Wife of {ZC1} Matilda, and had granted the reversion to Thomas Tuchet, Parson of Makkeworth, (sic) [Mackworth] and to John Tuchet, Chapline, in fee, to the use and profit of the said {ZC2} John Tuchet, Knight, and his Heirs, and with the intention that they, after the death of {ZC1} Sir John Tuchet and Wife of {ZC1} Matilda should enfeoff (Enfeoff means (under the feudal system) to give (someone) freehold property or land in exchange for their pledged service) the Heir of {ZC2} John Tuchet, Knight, in fee simple when the said heir should arrive at full age, and Wife of {ZC1} Matilda had Died in the lifetime of Sir John Tuchet, and after her death the said {ZC2} John Tuchet had entered and received the profits of the Manor and had Died seised of it. And John Tuchet, the Son of Richard Tuchet, of Makworth (sic) [Mackworth], had petitioned that whereas one John Bele, late Parson of Makkeworth (sic) [Mackworth], and William Makeworth, late Parson of Shenley, had been seised of the Manor and advowson of Makworth (sic) [Mackworth], and had granted them to John Tuchet, the Father of {ZC1} Sir John Tuchet and Wife of {ZC1} Matilda his Wife, and to the Heirs of the said John, Father of {ZC1} John, and by which grant the said {ZC1} John and Wife of {ZC1} Matilda had been seised of the Manor and advowson, and they had issue {ZC2} John Tuchet, Knight, and {ZC1} John Tuchet afterwards died, and the Manor had descended to the said {ZC2} John Tuchet, Knight, as Son and Heir, and he by his deed, under the name of {ZC2} John, Son of John Tochet (sic), **Knight,** and dated from Makeworth (sic) [Mackworth] in (18 R II), had granted the reversion of the Manor under the name of the reversion of the manor of Marketon (sic) with the advowson of the Church, to the said Thomas Tochet (sic), Parson of Makeworth (sic) [Mackworth], Magister John Tochet (sic) of Snerston (sic), John Curson of Ketelstone (sic) [Kedleston], and to the said John Tochet (sic), Son of Richard, and the said Thomas, Magister John, and John Curson had afterwards Died, and Wife of {ZC1} Matilda had also Died, and after their deaths the said Thomas, and John, Son of Richard had entered by virtue of the above grant. And afterwards the said {ZC2} John Tuchet, Knight, under the name of **ZC2** John Tochet (sic), Lord of Audeley and of Heley, by his deed dated from Marton 3rd November, (7 H IV) (1419-1420), had remitted and quit claimed to the said Thomas and John, Sons (note Sons) of Richard, and to their Heirs, all his right and claim in the said Manor and advowson, and by virtue of which grant and release they were in seisin of the Manor etc. until in consequence of the said Inquisition and under colour of certain Letters Patent of the King, dated the last 2nd May and by which the King had granted the custody of all the lands and tenements which lately belonged to {ZC2} John Tuchet, Knight, during the minority of {ZC3} James, Son and Heir of the said {ZC2} John, to William de Roos, they had been removed and excelled unjustly. The King, therefore, willing to do what was just, commanded the Sheriff to summon the said William de Roos to appear in Chancery at a month from Easter, to show cause why the said Letters Patent should not be revoked, dated 16th February (11 H IV), (1422) on which day William de Roos did not appear, and John Tuchet, the Son of Richard, having appeared by Attorney, and stated the facts as given above, prayed for restitution of the Manor and advowson of Makeworth (sic) [Mackworth].

And John Tykkyll, who appeared for the King, stated that {ZC2} John Tuchet Knight had Died seised of the Manor and appealed to a jury which was to be summoned for the Quindene at Trinity. After several adjournments through defect of a jury, the suit was moved by writ of 'nisi prius' to be heard before the Justices of Assize at Derby, when a jury returned a verdict in favour of the trustees, and the Letters Patent, so far as regarded the manor and advowson of Makeworth(sic) [Mackworth] were revoked and annulled. M12 (sic) [Believe this is a reference to the original document]

Comments on the above

- The key phrase in the above is 'John Tuchet, Knight under the name of John Tuchet, Lord of Audeley. This can only be {ZC1} and allows other Tag Reference numbers to be attributed accordingly
- The above document only refers to Matilda and yet it is used in Complete Peerage Vol 12 part 2 page 59 footnotes (j) to justify Maud as being the Wife of {ZC1}.

Topographer and Genealogist. Vol 1 edited by John Gough Nichols, FSA, published 1864

The above document has commencing page 197 a family tree of the Dabridgecourt family. Within that family tree it has:

Sir John Dabridgecourt K G el.circa April 1413. Constable of the Tower 1 Hen V (Rot. Pat.) Will d. (dated) 20 July, Cod (Codicil) 6 Aug 1415, pr.(proved) Nov eod (????) an (????) (e) [(e) refers to a note in original document). He married (See note below)

The note below states: The Wife of Sir John is stated in some of the pedigrees to be Maud, Daughter of Sir Richard Bromhall, and relict of Rob Touchet of Bughawton *(sic)* and Nether Whitley Co Cest; in others Matilda, Dau of Will Willoughby; ob May 1, 1445, Buried at Wollaston, co Notts.

Comments on the above

• (The above explains the confusion between Maud and Matilda. But does not explain the reasoning for the different suggestions between {ZT15} and {ZC1} as to who married the Matilda, whose second Marriage was to John Dabridgecourt.)

Appendix 'C' Who was the Father of {ZT7} Thomas Touchet. (<1205 – 1235)

From the various publications about the early Touchet's there appears to be two different names recorded for the Father of {ZT7} Thomas Touchet namely Simon Touchet & Robert Touchet.

The aim of this Appendix is to compare these various documents and decide which of these two Fathers is to be used in the 'The Baron's Audley' Family {ZT}' file.

Father Simon Touchet

The following documents record {ZT5} Simon Touchet (<1132? - <1205) as being the Father of {ZT7} Thomas Touchet.

The Complete Peerage 2nd Edition, Volume 12 part 2 published in 1959.

Page 54-55 of the above document records the Father of $\{ZT7\}$ Thomas Touchet as being Simon Touchet. The evidence for this is given in footnote (e) on page 55 of the above document. Footnote (e) states 'Thomas granted to Darley Abbey the land called Hascow with the adjacent

meadow "pro salute anime mee et pro anima patris Simonis de Tuschet (Cart of Darley Abbey p 502)

In the Darley Cartulary Page 502, Manuscript K39, is described as 'Grant in alms by Thomas de Tuschet, Son of Simon de Tuschet to the canons, of the land called Hascow with the adjacent meadow, with free access thereto, to hold at an annual rent of 2 shillings and the document is estimated to have been dated during the period 1200- 1235.

The Darley Cartulary page 502 does contain the Latin phrase 'pro salute anime mee et pro anima patris Simonis de Tuschet' Using 'Google' translate this is translated to 'On behalf of the salvation of my soul and the soul of the Father of Simon', on behalf of the Tuschet

The Cartulary of Darley Abbey - published in 1945. Edited By Reginald R. Darlington

The introduction of the Cartulary page xxxiv (34), States that Simon was succeeded by his Son Thomas (Grantor of K39). This is the same manuscript as referenced in 'The Complete Peerage'.

The introduction of the Cartulary page xxxii (32) States 'The History of the Tuschet Family had been discussed in some detail by Farrer, Mr Statham and Professor Tait and the errors of Ormerod (History of The County Palatine and City of Chester...etc') have been corrected.

The references are as follows:

Whilst this Document refers to an error in Ormerod it does not relate to the parentage of {ZT7} Thomas Touchet; the following paragraph is relevant

Page 30 has:

'As the greater part of the lands of John de Cumbrai descended to Thomas Tuschet it is an interesting question if Simon Tuschet was in possession of part of the Cumbrai Estates in 1203 by Marriage with a Lady of that family. If so his Heir would be one of the Heirs at Law of John de Cumbrai after the Death without issue during the period 1212-15 of John's Son and Heir Roger Cumbrai, and the course of the descent of part of the Cumbrai inheritance to Thomas Tuschet would be explained.'

Chartulary of Chester Abbey 'St. Werburgh's' published 1920 pages 122 to 124

Whilst this document does not appear to make reference to the parentage of {ZT7} Thomas Touchet. It does make several criticisms of The Ormerod - Touchet Family Tree.

D.A.J, xlviii pp 91 seq

D.A.J stands for *Derbyshire Archaeological Journal*, Volume 48 published in 1926. Pages 51 to 106 contain an article written by The Reverend S.P.H. Statham titled 'Later Descendants of Domesday Holders of Land in Derbyshire' and in particular pages 91 to 103 cover the Tuschet family.

Page 92 of this publication contains the following paragraph 'It is little surprising that no reliable pedigree of this important family has hitherto been available. That given in Ormerod's Cheshire (History of The County Palatine and City of Chester...etc') is demonstrably wrong, chiefly owing to the fact that the information contained in the records of Derbyshire were entirely neglected

Father Robert Touchet

Ormerod's History of Chester 2nd edition Volume 1 published between 1875 and 1882

Whilst Ormerod's History of Chester was published between 1875 and 1882 it includes copies of documents such as family trees produced earlier. The Touchet Family tree in Ormerod's publication was produced according to Ormerod by Booth & Sir Peter Leycester with additions and corrections. Sir Peter Leycester, 1st Baronet, lived from 1614 to 1678, and was the Son of Son of Peter Leycester and Elizabeth Leycester

Pedigree Produced for 1st Earl of Castlehaven

Whilst this family tree was produced in 1597 for the 1st Earl of Castlehaven, {ZC20} George Touchet; 11th Lord Audley of Heleigh, who died in 1617. It was not published until 1877 in The Genealogist.

Conclusion

{ZT7} Thomas Touchet can only have had 1 Father based on the fact that the more recent publications give his Father as Simon Touchet, believe we should in 'The Baron's Audley Family {ZA}' record the Father of {ZT7} Thomas Touchet as being Simon Touchet.

The implications for this decision are that we cannot use either Omerod's History of The County Palatine and City of Chester...etc' pedigree or that produced for the 1st Earl of Castlehaven prior to their information about {ZT7} Thomas Touchet.
