DIES AS RESULT OF BEING JAMMED BETWEEN TRAMS

Victim of the fourth fatal accident within the week, Norman Audley, 22, of 318 Berry street, St. James, died in the General hospital at 1.20 o'clock, Saturday afternoon, the result of injuries received when he was crushed between two street cars at the intersection of Portage avenue and Main street a. few hours previously.

Dr. H. M. Speechly, provincial coroner, has ordered an inquest into the fatality, but the date has not yet been set.

An employee of the Winnipeg Electric company, the young man was not on duty at the time, but was assisting the operator of one of the street cars.

Standing at the rear of the vehicle, he was adjusting the trolley, which had come off the line, when another car, rounding the curve in the opposite direction, sandwiched him against the stationary vehicle.

He was conveyed to the hospital in the police ambulance.

Audley is the sixth person to die as a result of traffic accidents in the city and district since the beginning of the year.
