**DEATH OF MR. GEORGE
AUDLEY**

**MANY BENEFACTIONS TO
LIVERPOOL**

Mr. George Audley, who was well known for his many art benefactions to Liverpool, died yesterday at his residence, Birkdale Lodge, Lulworth-road, Southport. He had been suffering from heart trouble, and the end came rather suddenly.

Born in Toxteth, Liverpool, George Audley was educated in Devonshire and entered the export bottling business in Liverpool. He joined the firm of J. P. O'Brien and Co., of Pall Mall, and rose to the position of managing director. Just after the war he figured in a highly successful business deal, being associated with Mr. Duncan McLeod, at one time of Liverpool and now proprietor of Skeabost, in Skye, in the purchase of Greig and Co., an old-established Glasgow firm of whisky manufacturers.
