£10,000 for Liverpool Cathedral

Mr. George Audley, J.P., of Birkdale Lodge, Lulworth Road, Southport, formerly connected with an export bottling business, and a generous patron of art, who died on February 25 last, aged 68 years, left estate of the gross value of £55,911, with net personality £55,873. He gives, on the death of his sisters, such pictures (not exceeding fifty in number) to the Corporation of Liverpool as they may choose, to be hung in the Walker Art Gallery, and, after other bequests, £10,000 to Liverpool Cathedral Committee, incorporated by the Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1885, to be used as part of the Building Fund, and the residue of the property to Dr. Barnardo's Homes.

£500 for Dalton Hall

Mr. Theodore Gregory, J.P., of 28, Victoria Crescent, Eccles, and of 3, York Street, Manchester, chartered accountant, a member of the Manchester Reform Club since 1884, who died on March 11 last, aged 82 years, left estate of the gross value of £5,173, with net personality £4,253. He gives—

£500 to the Dalton Hall of Residence of the Manchester University, "with which I have been closely connected for over fifty years" to be invested and the income used for an exhibition to be awarded annually in such manner as the Committee of Management shall think fit.

£500 to the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales "in recognition of my long-continued interest in the Manchester Society of Chartered Accountants" to be invested and the income awarded by the Council of that Institute to the candidate, being a member of the Manchester Chartered Accountants' Students Society, who obtains the highest aggregate number of marks in the final examinations held each year at the instance of the said institute.

£100 to the Extension Committee of the Lancashire and Cheshire Quarterly Meeting of the Society of Friends.

£100 to the Friends' Service Council of the Society of Friends (Friends' House, London).

£25 each to his housekeeper Annie Hughes and his maid Harriet Robinson, if respectively still in his service at his death and not under notice either given or received.

Leeds Man's £5,000 for Charity

Mr. Frederick William Gallon, of The Granby Hotel, Harrogate, governing director of Gallons, Ltd., grocers and provision merchants, Ingram Road, Holbeck, Leeds, and many other places in the North of England, died on February 21 last, aged 73 years, leaving estate of the gross value of £195,015, with net personality £182,693. After making provision for his wife, he left the residue of the property in trust, one-sixth to go to pay—

£1,400 to the Leeds Tradesmen Benevolent Institution.

£1,000 to the Yorkshire Home for Chronic and Incurable Diseases, Harrogate.

£1,000 to the Leeds General Infirmary.

£500 to the Leeds Unmarried Women's Benevolent Institution.

£500 to the National Lifeboat Institution.

£500 to the Harrogate Infirmary.

£200 to the Leeds Poor Children's Holiday Camp Association.

£400 to his clerk, Frederick Asquith Rayner.

£200 to his daughter, Miss Mary Gallon.
