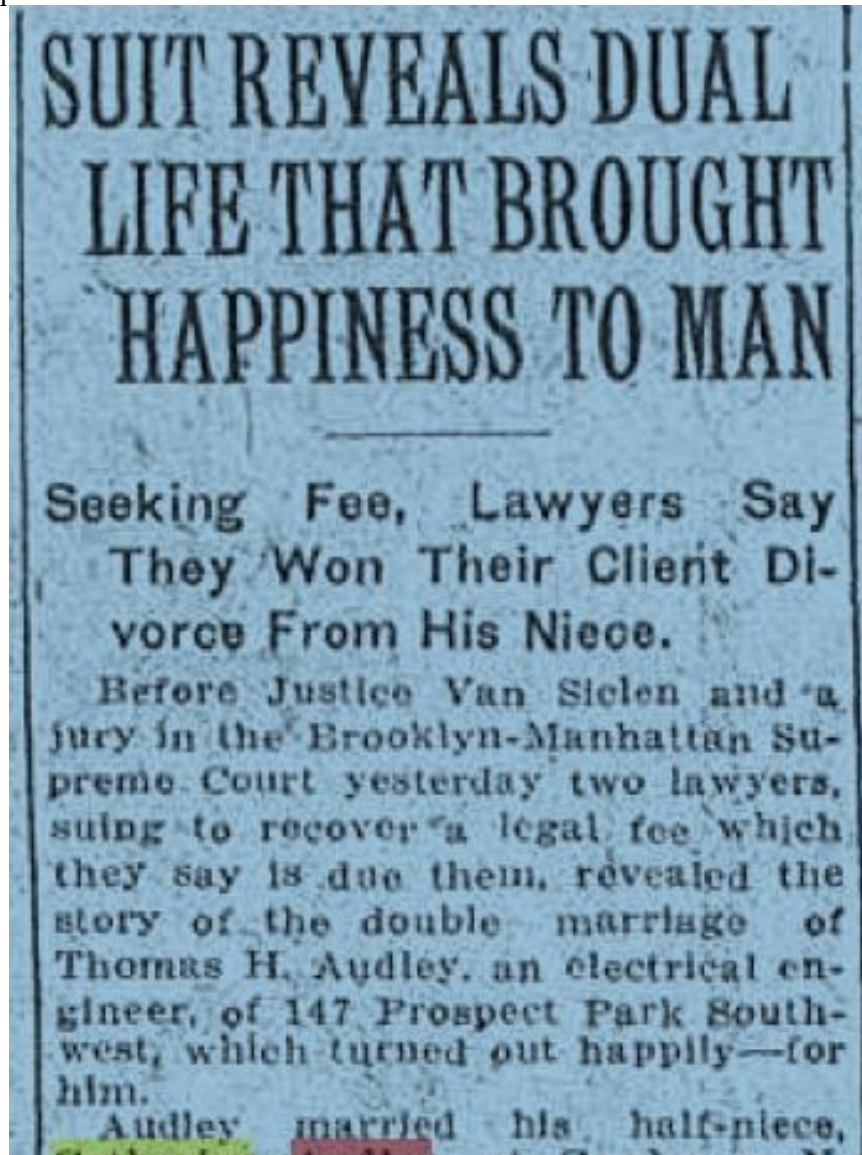

Audley married his half-piece, Catherine Audley, at Gardener, N. Y., in 1904. Ten years later he moved to Brooklyn and there began to live with his present wife, who gave birth to two children. The niece-wife discovered the new alliance and brought suit for divorce and Audley brought a counter suit for annulment, on the ground that the first marriage was illegal. Audley lost and the first Mrs. Audley won, until the two lawyers, Matthew T. Abbruzzo and Harry S. Austin, appeared on the scene. They took an appeal for him to the Court of Appeals, and the decisions were reversed, so that Audley was able to marry his present wife and legitimize her two children. For this they charged a fee of \$5,500. Audley paid \$3,000 of it, and the present suit is to recover the balance.
