






A long discussion ensued; but no good came of it, and the Board adjourned after giving a cheque for £1 to Francis **Audley** for keeping the pumps in repair.

Francis Audley claimed 18s 6d for repairs of the pumps. It appears Mr Murray settled with him for 15s, and that he did some other jobs which brought his bill to 18s 6d.

Mr Hopkins did not quite understand the matter in the absence of Mr Murray.

John Neill, the late Inspector, said that at a meeting held in the Chairman's house, where the flag man was paid, the matter was referred to Mr Murray who agreed to give Audley 15s, the same as he got for the Commissioner's market pump.

They granted a cheque for the full amount.
