Introduction

This document contains as far as possible an exact copy of **Chapter XX** 'Audley of Liverpool' from the Audley Pedigrees, compiled for George Audley of Liverpool by Aleyn Lyell Reade, Hon M.A. Oxon, of Liverpool, and privately published by Percy Lund, Humphries & Co. London and Bradford in the mid to late 1930s.

This document consists of four sections. The first consist of the 'general extracts' of information from various sources. These pages are a scanned copy of the original pages of the original publication. The following three sections contain the information regarding the four 'separate' branches of the Audley family that are detailed in the original document. These section have been scanned and then 'OCRed' to put them into a word processor format. The ultimate aim is to update as much as possible these four sections. Unfortunately the OCR software used was not perfect and although each section has been checked this process may have caused transcription errors. If anyone spots any such errors could you please advise us through the website contact page and we will revise this document accordingly. The original publication is understood that it consists of three volumes consisting of twenty chapters in total and originally published in 3 volumes. The George Audley of Liverpool (1864 – 1932) who funded the original publication is part of Family Pedigree 'C' of this Chapter XX. Unfortunately he died before the third volume could be published. Whilst approximately 250 copies of this book were printed and circulated to various Libraries worldwide, we are only aware of the actual location of two copies, one in the Liverpool Record Office (now bound as one volume) on the 3rd Floor, Central Library, William Brown Street, Liverpool, L3 8EW, and the other in the Birkenhead Central Library, Borough Road, Birkenhead, Wirral CH41 2XB. (For a list of Libraries believed to have been sent a copy), see the Audley Family History website, 'Published Information', in the 'Audley Pedigrees' by A. L. Reade indexed section. In the 'General extracts' section of this Chapter references are made to 'Audley of Waterford' and 'Audley of Inistoge'. A Narrative Pedigree for these families is not included within the original publication. However there are references included in the website within 'Audley Family Pedigrees of 'E','F','J','L', 'M', respectively. As far as we are concerned anyone may copy and use this document in the search for their family history, however it would be appreciated of being informed by e-mail where this document goes to. Our long-term aim is to update the four pedigrees referenced 'A' 'B' 'C' 'D' with the aim of identifying where they were before they appeared in the Liverpool area. Just for the record the Audley Website Team are part of Family Pedigrees 'A' & 'B', and who do not appear in those documents, however our Father's dates of Birth is recorded.

When Mr. George Audley first asked me to make enquiries into his family history he not only looked upon his name as an extremely uncommon one, but also thought that there were no Audleys in Liverpool except those descended from his great-grandfather, William Audley [1776?-1833]. The immense mass of evidence which gradually accumulated about Audleys of the past rather astonished him, as did the discovery that there were several other families of the name in Liverpool, as long settled there as his own and quite as prolific.

Certainly during the last century or so Liverpool has been pre-eminently the home of the Audleys in England, sheltering more of the name than any other district. But the reason for so many of them descending upon the town at the same period, and where they came from, has yet to be discovered. There is no evidence of Audleys being settled in Liverpool before them. They were mostly in poor circumstances, and, following the fate of others of the name elsewhere, have continued generally to be wage earners.

As will be learned from the pedigrees that follow there have been (apart from Audleys who came from Ireland) four main lines of the family in Liverpool. These I have scheduled as [A], [B], [C] and [D], as below, and in the general evidences that follow I have as far as possible given the reference letter identifying each item with its particular pedigree. I have thought it better to print these general evidences en bloc than to split them up and divide the items among the pedigrees to which they refer, as by so doing I give a clearer view of what searches have been undertaken and what each search has yielded. In this form they afford a useful guide to anyone anxious to see exactly what ground has been covered and where further effort might be effective. And these general evidences include a considerable number of references which will be required later on when the Audleys of Ireland are dealt with.

- [A] Descendants of Samuel Audley [1775?-1840], who married Hannah Gerrard in 1799.
- [B] Descendants of John Audley [1767?-1816], who married Esther Watson about 1790.
- [C] Descendants of William Audley [1776?-1833], who married Alice Dwerryhouse in 1805.
- [D] Descendants (only known to one generation) of *Charles Audley* [1773?-1827], who married Sarah Mylcrist in 1796.

The evidences show yet another contemporary of the name, Thomas Audley, of Shaw's Brow, joiner, with a wife Mary, whose daughter Mary, born 18 Nov. 1791, was baptized 3 Jan. 1792, at St. Nicholas's, Liverpool. Perhaps he was the Thomas Audley who was of Sir Thomas's Buildings (now Sir Thomas Street) in 1790, or even (considering the various trades ascribed to other members of the family) the Thomas Audley who was a shoemaker at 9 Johnson's Alley in 1796 (Gore's Directory). But we know no more of any such Thomas Audley, so perhaps he left the town.

There were, therefore, at least five Audleys who established themselves in Liverpool round about the end of the 18th century, Samuel, John, William, Charles and Thomas. No tradition of relationship remains among the descendants of the three branches still in active being in the town. Yet it is difficult to imagine that such a number of men with this uncommon surname should simultaneously settle there without some relationship to cause common action. In status there was no great difference, one a carter, one a joiner with engineering tendencies, one a book-keeper who also kept a public house, one a joiner who was also a grocer, and one a plain joiner. Joinering seems to have been their principal occupation, and even in the case of the book-keeper his three sons all became shipwrights.

Though, as has been pointed out, no tradition of relationship survives today there is one positive piece of evidence as to kinship between the families of two of the five Audleys mentioned above. For when Amelia, daughter of Charles Audley [1773?-1827], died at the age of 80 in 1883, her death was notified to the authorities by "Hannah Swarbrick, Cousin, Present at death, Rock View, Old Swan" (post, p. 314). And this Hannah Swarbrick was a daughter of John Audley [1801-1879], and granddaughter of Samuel Audley [1775?-1840] (post, p. 295). This seems pretty near proof that Samuel and Charles Audley were related closely: if they were brothers Mrs. Swarbrick would have been only first-cousin-once-removed to Miss Amelia Audley.

There is yet another suggestion of relationship in the naming of some of the children. Both Samuel Audley [1775?-1840], and William Audley [1776?-1833],

had sons called Charles, perhaps after Charles, the father of Amelia. And, more significant, this last Charles christened two of his sons Stanley, one in 1801 and one in 1808, while William Audley [1776?-1833] had a grandson Stanley Audley [1845-1911]. It is true that Charles seems to have got the name from his wife's (? brother), Stanley Mylcrist (post, p. 267), and that Stanley Audley [1845-1911] was not related to the Mylcrists. But this last Stanley's father, William Audley [1810-57], was of an age to have known the Stanley Audley born in 1808 (who died in 1831), and he might well have borrowed the name from a cousin.

Now none of the five Audleys we are dealing with offer any clue as to their origins with the exception of Samuel [1775?-1840]. As I shall show (post, p. 288), this Samuel had proved associations with Capenhurst, in the parish of Shotwick, in the Wirral area of Cheshire, and with brickmaking there; while a John Audley, a brickmaker at Ledsham nearby from at least 1794, was buried at Shotwick in October 1811, when he was a man of about 65 or more. Probably Samuel was a son of John, though wide enquiry has failed to find clear evidence on the point. Bearing in mind the relationship that can scarcely be questioned between Samuel Audley [1775?-1840], and Charles Audley [1773?-1827], and the relationship suggested by Christian names between them and William Audley [1776?-1833], we cannot but ask whether the three men were not brothers who left their Wirral home to settle in Liverpool, not many miles away, and whether John Audley [1767?-1816] and Thomas Audley, the Liverpool joiner of 1791, were not two further brothers. Against this it might be argued that the name Samuel was not used except by the family of Samuel.

The following summary of where in Liverpool the four contemporary progenitors of the Liverpool Audleys lived, so far as it has been traced, must be considered, as perhaps bearing upon the question of their possible relationship:

- [A] Samuel Audley [1775?-1840], farmer, carter and labourer, the only one of the four who never appears in the directory, was living in Mann Street in 1804 and 1807, in New Bird Street from 1808 to 1822, and died in Fisher Street in 1840, all in the Toxteth Park area, near the docks at the south end of the city, where most of his large family of sons remained.
- [B] John Audley [1767?-1816], joiner and cotton engine maker, was living in Fontenoy Street from 1791 to 1804; in Chisenhale Street, off Vauxhall Road, in 1811; and for 1815 and 1816, the last two years of his life, was of Henry Edward Street, off Fontenoy Street. These streets were all on the north side of the city, away from the docks, and his descendants kept in the same area.
- [C] William Audley [1776?-1833], book keeper and victualler, was living in Mann Street in 1807, and in Kitchen Street in 1816 and 1818. So that, like Samuel above, he belonged to the dock area at the south end, with which his children and grandchildren largely remained associated.
- [D] Charles Audley [1773?-1827], joiner and grocer, was in Blundell Street in 1805, and in White Street the same year; in Brown Street (by White Street) in 1807; in Cornwallis Street, with a yard in Kitchen Street, in 1810 and 1811; in St.

James's Street in 1813-14; in Bridgewater Street in 1816-18; in Watkinson Street in 1821; in Stanhope Street, with a yard in Bridgewater Street, in 1827; and he died in Portland Street in 1827. These streets, again, are all pretty close together, in the southern dock area, except for Portland Street, which was at the northern end of the city, off Vauxhall Road. His widow in 1841 was back in

It will be seen that Samuel, William and Charles Audley were all associated with the Toxteth Park district of Liverpool, and that while Charles had a yard in Kitchen Street in 1810-11, William was living in the same street in 1816-18. This may be evidence in favour of relationship. Of the four, John Audley alone favoured the northern side of the city, where Thomas Audley, the joiner of Shaw's Brow, was quite near him (in Fontenoy Street) in 1791.

There are a number of puzzling facts to confuse the question of origins. No Audley occurs in any of the Liverpool directories from 1776 till 1790. But who was the Mrs. Alice Audley who occurs from 1800 to 1807, first as a bakehouse keeper and afterwards as proprietor of a boarding house, in Hurst Street and King Street, both near the river front, on different sides of the Old Dock that was soon to be filled up to form the site of the new Custom House? Nowhere, as far as my enquiries have gone, is there any record of her existence except in the directory. She cannot have been Alice Dwerryhouse, who did not marry William Audley until 1805. And, while concerned with this name, who was the "Alice Audley, Lady, unmard.," shown in the census of 1841 as resident in Morris Court, Jamaica Street? The "Lady" in this connexion is unusual. And who again was the "William Audley, engraver," shown in the 1821 directory as at 30 Park Lane?

There are, of course, a number of Audleys among the general evidences, at various dates, who cannot be attached to any of the pedigrees, but most of them are not significant. There was a Maurice Audley, a labourer in Lumber Street, who died 3 Feb. 1842, aged 86, which carries his birth back to about 1756, earlier than any of the Liverpool Audleys we have discussed. But I regard him merely as a "stray," and probably an Irishman, as I do the Alexander Audley for whom the following little pedigree can be constructed from the general evidences:-

The wealth of evidence that follows will sufficiently serve to show the extent of the efforts that have been made to solve the problem of the origin of the Liverpool Audleys-efforts that have proved entirely unsuccessful.* It is strange that there are no wills, or administrations, to throw any light upon the problem, for though they were not people of much substance four of the five Audleys who appeared contemporaneously in Liverpool towards the end of the 18th century were of sufficient importance to get into the directory, and might well have had something to bequeath.

even when engaged in such serious work. The clue that would have opened the door to the light may have been missed, and I myself may-indeed must-have failed to exhaust the whole field of evidence. Methodically though I have attempted to cover all the ground, there cannot but be things I have overlooked, and which some future inquirer may happily alight upon.

Only those out of touch with practical genealogy, and ignorant of its austere ideals, will see any incongruity in dealing at such length with families who have mostly fallen on lean times, and who, though in one notable case successful in business, have in several other cases not escaped actual poverty. Whatever their origin, and whatever the chances of ever connecting them with any of the old Audley lines, at least their numbers promise that they represent the Audleys of the future, for whom this work is principally compiled.

PEDIGREE A DESCENDANTS OF SAMUEL AUDLEY WHO MARRIED HANNAH GERRARD IN 1799

This pedigree takes pride of place among those of Liverpool Audleys because it is the only one in, which there is any evidence to suggest where its first figure came from. The census returns of 1851 provided the first clue, by telling us that Hannah Gerrard (or Jarratt) was born at Sutton, Cheshire. That her eldest son, William Audley, was born at the same place; that her second son, John Audley, was born at Chester, in Cheshire; while her third son, Samuel Audley, was born at Neston, in the same county.

This evidence invested with a new significance the following record I had from the Chester Probate Office:-

JOHN AUDLEY, late of Ledsham, in the par. of Neston, co. Chester, brickmaker, decd. Admon. of his estate granted 5 Oct. 1811 to Mary Audley, his widow. Bond £80. Sureties, Thomas Wilcoxon, of Ledsham, husbandman, and Ralph Wilcoxon, of Chester, Officer of Customs. Under £40·Intesdate died 28 Sept. 1811.

A search through the Neston registers from 1770 to 1838 produced no Audley entries. But the registers of the adjoining parish of Shotwick, which were searched from 1700 to 1838, proved more fruitful, and the following entries were found: -

We therefore find these Audleys associated with Sutton, Ledsham, Neston, Capenhurst and Shotwick. These places are all within a distance of about five miles of one another, in the southerly portion of Wirral. Sutton was presumably Great or Little Sutton, both townships in the parish of Eastham, but close to Ledsham and Capenhurst, and from eight to a dozen miles from Liverpool, on the other side of the Mersey.

There is no space here to detail all the methodical efforts that have been made, not only throughout Wirral itself but also throughout the whole county of Cheshire, to find other entries relating to these Audleys. I cannot do more than say that they have been quite unsuccessful.

In Wirral no other Audley entries at all have been discovered, and in the rest of Cheshire only a few, for this period, in the easterly area.

Whether the census return is correct in giving Chester itself m the birthplace of John Audley, in 1801, I cannot say, but he was baptised at Shotwick, which is about five miles from Chester, as was his brother William, who the same census <u>says was</u> born at Sutton, eighteen months earlier. The statement must be taken in conjunction with a belief among some of the older members of the family, that the Audleys came from Upton, a township in the perish of St. Mary-on-the-hill, Chester. This was a clue, which raised hopes of a discovery, but like all the others it led to none.

We are left therefore with the evidence from the Shotwick registers, which at least establishes the important fact that the two elder sons of Samuel Audley who married Hannah Gerrard in Liverpool in 1799 were baptised at that Cheshire parish church. Taken in conjunction with the facts that Samuel, the father, is in the Chester transcript described as a brickmaker, and that a John Audley of Ledsham, brickmaker, died in September 1811, and was buried at Shotwick, this is of great significance. We can scarcely doubt that Samuel Audley was closely related to John Audley, if not indeed his son. John Audley had been brickmaking at Ledsham since 1794 at least, when he lost his first wife and married a second, and the licence shows him to have been born about 1744, and thus about thirty years older than Samuel. If we could only find where John Audley lived before he came to Ledsham, and the baptisms of his children if he had any, we might be on the verge of a great discovery.

Who "Mary Auldley" was, buried at Shotwick in 1827, aged 84, we do not know, unless she was the widow of John Audley. The fact that her age does not agree with that stated on her marriage need cause no surprise, and she cannot be explained otherwise. No stone to the memory of John Audley can be found at Shotwick.

As Thomas Wilcoxon, of Ledsham, and Ralph Wilcoxon, of Chester, were sureties for the administration of John Audley's estate in 1811 I naturally suspected some connection But I have abstracts of a number of wills of members of this Wilcoxon family, which was connected with Ledsham, Chester, and Cornist in Fintshire, and there is no mention of any Audley.

There are no "special" evidences for this pedigree, but only those among the general extracts from Liverpool records which precede it. As regards all Its modern ramifications have received very special help from Mr. Samuel Audley, of Waldegrave Road, Liverpool (who, as a young corporal, had the doubtful pleasure of trying to teach me the elements of drill when I joined up at Canterbury in 1916), as well as from his grandfather's first cousin, Miss Hannah Audley, born 1850 daughter of Thomas Audley. It is of interest to know that this father and uncle remember how when they were young their parents went over to Neston to look for records of the family, though without success. I have also got certificates of the following deaths, and utilised the information supplied: --Randel Audley, 30 Oct. r868; Charles Audley, 26 Aug. 1871; Frances Audley, 8 Feb. 1876; Samuel Audley, 27 June1876; John Audley, 9 Jan. 1879; Mary Barron Audley, 6 Apl. 1879 Jane Audley; 17 Dec.1882; Isabella Audley, 12 Feb. 1883; Ann Audley, 22 Ap1. 1887; Samuel Audley, 7 Aug.1887; Charles Audley, 2 May 1891; Joseph Audley, to Oct. r8gr; and Alice Audley, 16 Aug. 1894

In Gore's Liverpool Directory for 1829 we find Jonathan and Roger Fisher, ship and boat builders, a Baffin st. Jonathan Fisher, shipbuilder, died 28 Jan. 1831, and was buried at St. James's Cemetery (see Liverpool Epitaphs, in Liverpool Free Public Reference Library).

The Liverpool Poll Books for 1761, 1780, 1784, 1790,1796, 1802, 1806, 1807, 1812, 1818, and 1820 contain no Audley. In 1830 John Audley, shipwright, Mann Street, voted in November for William Ewart. In 1857, on 28 March, John Audley, Brunswick Dock, voted for T. B. Horsfall and Charles Turner, against J. C. Ewart.

The Alexander Ryan who acted as John Audley's godfather in 1806 (ante, P. 266) was no doubt the man of the name whom Gore's Directory shows to have been a joiner Hill Street in 1805: he afterwards was a lime-burner at 16 Harrington Street. I have not discovered the parentage of John's mother, Alice Dwerryhouse. She was evidently a Roman Catholic, for though she married William Audley at St. Peter's parish church, with her father's consent, in 1805, four at least of her children, down to 1819, were baptized into the Roman Catholic Church. She must have relinquished her faith, or not been a very close adherent, for all her children grew up as members of the Church of England. There was, as Gore's Directory shows, a John Dwerryhouse living at 1 Sefton Street in 1807, whose ship building yard was in Queen Street South, and as three of Alice Dwerryhouse's sons became shipwrights this may provide a clue. Moreover, the will of Martha Dwerryhouse, of Garston Lancs., widow, dated 26 Mch. 1801 and proved at Chester 11 Aug. 1802, leaves £50 to John Dwerryhouse, the son of John Dwerryhouse, of Liverpool, ship carpenter (her executor and residuary legatee), as well as another £50 to Sarah, wife of John Sharples, of Garston, farmer. It will be observed that a John Sharples was godfather to Alice's second son, Thomas Audley, in 1808 (ante, p. 266). From her marriage licence m 1805 (ante, p. 301), it is reasonable to conclude that Alice Dwerryhouse's mother was a Wilkinson; but here again I have been unable to get evidence of it, after consulting various wills. From Ronald Stewart-Brown's Liverpool Ships in the Eighteenth Century, 1932, p.131 in the account he gives of the principal Shipwrights, I learn that Dwerryhouse and Co, were launching ships in 1791 and 1792 and that their yard in 1800 was at the south end of the Queen's Dock. "John Dwerryhouse, Robert (?) Watmough and Jonathan Wilkinson were then the partners in the business." This proof that John Dwerryhouse the shipbuilder was in partnership with Jonathan Wilkinson seems to point still more strongly to his connexion with Alice Dwerryhouse whose uncle was John Wilkinson, and whose sons by William Audley all became shipwrights.5

⁵ 'At the very moment of having to send my MS. to the printer I have got the followings very important piece of evidence --JONATHAN WILKINSON, of Liverpool, carpenter. One of the great puzzles in connexion with this pedigree is that, although the Family Bible tells us that William Audley who starts it died on 7 May 1833 I have been unable to trace his burial in or near Liverpool (see ante, p. 267) Nor have I found the burial of his widow Alice (Dwerryhouse), after her death on 4 April 1851 in Lower Mann Street. The certificate of her death describes her as widow of William Audley, "shipwright," but, though his sons adopted that trade, we know him only as a "clerk") and a "victualler." Both he and his wife wrote a decent hand, as can be seen from their signatures on marriage

There can be little doubt that this Jonathan Wilkinson, "carpenter," was the ex-partner of John Dwerryhouse the shipbuilder, so that we are hot on the scent. As Alice Audley was his stepchild, he must have married her mother, the widow of a Dwerryhouse. There is a difficulty in that consent for her marriage in 1805 was given by John Wilkinson, her "uncle" on behalf of her "father." But perhaps Jonathan Wilkinson had already married her mother, and "father" stands for "stepfather." At any rate, the Dwerryhouse-Wilkinson-Audley connexion; now disclosed leave no doubt as to how it was that the; sons of William Audley and Alice Dwerryhouse all adopted the trade of shipwright

Though his grandfather had worked himself up from the position of a working shipwright without capital to a partnership in a leading firm of shipbuilders, and his father had also engaged in the same business as a principal, the family fortunes had rather declined again. The firm of Cato, Miller and Co., in which John Audley was a partner from about 1848 to 1867 were too much ahead of their time; they embarked on the construction of iron ships and paid the common penalty of pioneers by losing al their fortune, though they were able to pay their creditors in full⁶ After this calamity, which necessitated his leaving the house to which he had moved in Cressington Park, he joined with his son William in forming a new firm, taking in Charles Mead, the firm becoming Audley, Son and Mead. But Mead soon let the firm down, and went to Australia. Father and son then, about 1870, took into partnership George H. Willmer, a fellow apprentice of the father's, under the style of Audley, Son and Willmer. Things, however, did not prosper: John and William Audley seem to have dropped out about 1877, leaving Willmer to carry on alone in the same yard in Jordan St. William Audley started a small coal business, but never restored the family to prosperity, so that his children had to depend mainly upon their own exertions for any advancement in life

George Audley was educated first at Dr. Nathaniel Bushell's private academy at 50 Devonshire Road, Liverpool, which he left in 1876 for Kingston School, Yeovil. After three years there, he was apprenticed to Messrs. John Swire and Sons, London merchants and ship owners, at their branch office, 32 The Temple Dale Street, Liverpool, having faded, as he would recall with a certain amount of satisfaction, to pass the test for the Royal Insurance Company's office, through some stupid mistake in spelling. When the firm closed their Liverpool office, he transferred to Messrs. J.P. O'Brien and Co., in the same building. Mr. O'Brien was a cousin of the Swires, and his firm traded as general merchants, but specialised in the export of beer and stout. George Audley's whole business life was spent with the firm, which in 1902 removed their office to 5 Pall Mall, a few streets away, some five years later changing to 10 Pall Mall, where they still carry on. The bottling stores were then moved to their present situation m Tariff Street, Vauxhall Road.

Without special ability, in the scholastic sense, he entertained as a youth very restricted ambitions as to his financial future. He was always a very modest and retiring man, who never pushed himself forward in any way. But in addition to much shrewdness he possessed boundless industry and in his early business days, when all sorts of difficulties confronted the firm, he thought nothing of working twelve or fourteen hours a day, alternating with night journeys to Glasgow and Dublin. His energy, combined with his tact, brought the firm through various troubles, and eventually he rose to be managing director. This position ensured him a comfortable security, but it was through a business deal for which he claimed little credit himself that he acquired the fortune which quite altered his circumstances. In March 1918 his firm entered into a contract for the purchase of the oldestablished business of Wright and Greg, Ltd., distillers, of Glasgow, the consideration being in the neighbourhood of one-and-a half-millions. This deal was negotiated by George Audley with Mr. Duncan McLeod, now the laird of Skeabost, in Skye, who was then managing director of Wright and Greig. Mr. McLeod joined the board of O'Briens, as director, to deal with the newly acquired whisky interests. About February 1920 O'Briens made another move, entering into negotiations for the purchase of the business, distilleries and immense whisky stocks of Bulloch, Lade and Co., Ltd., of Glasgow, the figure involved being close on two million pounds. Very soon after the completion of this huge deal, O'Briens decided to dispose of all their newly acquired distilleries and whisky stocks, and for this purpose it was necessary to put the company into voluntary liquidation, which became effective on 31 March 1920. The parent business, of home and export bottling, was disposed of to a company which still carries on under the old name, at the same addresses.

It was the business genius of Mr. McLeod which lay behind these big deals, but considerable credit must belong to George Audley in connexion with them. He was not a man, probably, who would on his own initiative have ventured schemes of such magnitude. yet he saw his opportunity and had the courage and enterprise to accept it and profit by it. At any rate, he came out with a substantial fortune of £180, 000, which enabled him to retire in the prime of life, to devote himself to furthering those various philanthropic and artistic causes that he had so very much at heart. In fact, henceforth, his was a dedicated life, though he would hardly have thought himself of claiming it as such. The collection of pictures became his great hobby, when he had the means to indulge it, and in 1924 he presented fourteen valuable paintings to the Walker Art Gallery in Liverpool. The first gift by which he became well known to the public was the result of his interest in art. In 1925 Sir Frederick Bowring, then Mayor of Liverpool, who had already given £1000 to the fund for extending the Walker Art Gallery, undertook to match any further donation, and George Audley responded to the challenge with a promise of £10,000, which was thus automatically doubled. In this same year he added forty three pictures to his previous gift, mostly by Victorian artists. Over a period of some fifteen years he continued to present a large number of pictures to the same Gallery, from the collection he had formed, mostly representative of the English school, the best known, perhaps, being Sargent's "Vespers,"

which he gave in 1928. In the completed Gallery one of its fine rooms was named the "Audley Gallery." He also gave to the Corporation a number of pieces of statuary, including John Gibson's "Garland Dance," which stands in the entrance hall of Allerton House, the life-size figures of Adam and Eve, by Arthur G. Walker, A.R.A., and Spence's statue of Flora Macdonald, now in the Sefton Park palm house. A handsome gold clock for the Town Hall entrance was another gift. But the gift by which he became best known to the public of Liverpool, and its young people particularly, was that Of a replica of Sir George Frampton's statue of Peter Pan in Kensington Gardens, costing nearly £2,000, the local site chosen being in Sefton Park. Before his death he had arranged for another replica at a much higher cost, to be placed in Sefton Park, of the famous statue of Eros in London, with a fountain. There were some complaints from artists that he did not commission fresh work instead of getting replicas of existing pieces, but he was following his own taste in the matter and associating it with that of the public whose pleasure was his principal care. To Stanley Park he gave a children's garden with a floral clock and other attractive features. His interesting collection of "Toby" and other jugs was given to the Liverpool Museum.

To the beautiful church at Sefton, a few miles from Liverpool, where his elder brother had been confirmed, he presented a valuable copy of Botticelli's "Madonna," in a specially designed oak frame, which hangs on the south wall; and also a copy by Albani of Raphael's Tuscany "Madonna", which hangs in the priest's vestry. This was in 1927, when he also placed a stained-glass window in the north wall of the church, with other members of his family, to the memory of their father and mother. In 1926 he was unanimously coopted a member of the Arts Sub-committee of the Corporation, in recognition of his services to art. In 1929 he was appointed to the Commission of the Peace for Liverpool. He was chairman of the Stewart-Jones Evening Homes.

For some years before his death he had been troubled with his heart, and been compelled to "go slow." Of a fairly stout build, and inclined almost to pride himself on his physical inactivity, he rather felt that justice would have been better served by such a complaint attacking one of those people who put their hearts to severer tests. Death came to him suddenly, as he was dressing, on 25 February 1932, in his 68th year. He was buried at Southport Cemetery on 31 February, after a service at Christ Church there.

His will, dated 14 April 1930, with a codicil of 23 January 1931, was proved in April 1932. The gross value was only £55,911.6.5, and the net value £53,873.3 .9 Apart from legacies, etc., to relatives and others, his principal bequest was one of £10,000 to the building fund of the Liverpool Cathedral, which was a project after his own heart, even had he not been a staunch supporter of the Church of England. He left the choice of not more than fifty of his pictures to the Corporation of Liverpool, for the Walker Art Gallery. Any residue of his estate was to go to Dr. Barnardo's Homes.

George Audley, though a genuine lover of pictures and taking a real joy in those of his own choice, was not in touch with any modern art movements, which he was quite unable to appreciate. Their manifestations, in architecture as well as in pictorial art; convinced him that he was spending the last years of his life in the "age of ugliness". The school of Victorian artists he favoured "slumped" so badly in public estimation that when the residue of his collection, consisting of 98 items, was sold at Christie's on 12 May 1932 they realised only the paltry sum of £1314. 6. ·6. He never attempted any painting himself, though his elder brother, before business absorbed all his energies, practised the art with enthusiasm, while their sister Edith had a taste for painting in oils.

He had very definite ideas regarding the responsibilities of those blessed with surplus means, and when he retired it was with the deliberate intention of giving back most of his money to the city in which he had been fortunate enough to acquire it-and he never overlooked the fortunate element in his career. Being a bachelor, he was free to act upon his principles. At Birkdale Lodge, Southport, where he removed from a smaller house in the neighbourhood after his retirement, he had a roomy and comfortable home, terribly crowded, on his own admission, with pictures and other works of art, but he was a man of

simple tastes who spent comparatively little on himself. His two unmarried sisters, who lived with him in great affection, he had provided for, and his system was gradually to denude himself of his capital, in chunks, with the result that he was looked upon as a man of much larger means than he really was, by those who thought he was giving out of his income. His will evidences how far he had travelled along the road of financial renunciation. Though (or perhaps because) a very modest man, he took a great but simple pride in what he had been able to do for his native city, and in any recognition that, quite unsought, came his way. His frequent visits to the studios of London artists, both on his own behalf and that of the Liverpool Arts Committee, were a personal delight to him, as bringing him into friendly contact with men whose attainments he envied and admired. He was a man of quiet, very deliberate, and homely speech, whose kindly expression, and eyes twinkling from behind his glasses, were often more eloquent than his words. Slow to make up his mind, he was not easily moved from his path when he had chosen it. No one could visit him in his home without feeling attracted by his complete unpretentiousness, his guiet, pawky humour, his deep-seated spirit of kindness, his sincerity, his unselfishness, and his real desire to make the world a better and happier place, especially for children. He was prompted by pure benevolence of heart, and not by any of those envenomed principles which sometimes make philanthropists terrible even in their generosity. At the same time, he could now and again slyly discharge little shafts of sarcasm that found a billet with the sensitive.

A very feeling tribute to George Audley as a man was contributed to The Liverpool Daily Post by Mr. Percy Corkhill, who as Lord Mayor's secretary came much into contact with him: --

To know George Audley was to love him. He was not easy to know--his nature was of the retiring kind; how he hated to fuss. But his heart was of gold. Most people will remember him as the benefactor of art. His gifts were abundant, and as a donor his name will long be remembered in Liverpool as well as in the Metropolis.

Mr. Audley had a passion for Liverpool. His mind was always on the city he loved so well. He was jealous for its prestige, and he carried his dislike of other preferences to the extreme. Nothing is too good for Liverpool, he used to say, and he deplored the passing of the days when the heads of great firms were the giants of business here before the trek to the South. But most of us will remember George Audley for his love of children. He was at his best when among them. Nothing was too good for them. The poorer they were the more they attracted him. His Peter Pan is more than a piece of poetic beauty in Sefton Park-the garden at Stanley Park is more than a floral clock and collection of whimsical statuary; they are monuments to the memory of a man whose soul was moved at the starving mind and vision of the average child--and of the determination to bring some joy, day by day, into the drab existence of some at least.

Mr. Audley's last visit to Liverpool was to see his friends, and to see the site for Eros in Sefton Park, and although he was obviously unwell he paid his last visit and, so it happened, his farewell to the Peter Pan dell, when he embraced little ones who had come for their afternoon visit to fondle the tiny figures in Frampton's masterpiece. George Audley has passed, but his memory is sweet and fragrant.

In an address before the funeral the Rev. L. J. Coursey, Vicar of Christ Church, Southport, where George Audley was for several years a sidesman and a generous supporter of its social activities, emphasised the lovable simplicity of his character: -

I suppose we naturally think first of those public acts of munificence which are familiar to all minds. George Audley lived in Southport, but his heart was in Liverpool. He was a native of that city, his ancestors had lived in it, and Liverpool to him was the place above all others. And so he took joy in doing what he could for it. In a material age he was a patron of art, and thereby he rendered no small service to the public weal. In a world dazzled by the achievements of science he remembered the greater things that men pre inclined to forget--art and beauty. Generations to come will thank God for what he did. Perhaps the

biggest thing about him was that he had preserved so wonderfully the heart of a child. He presented that exquisite replica of Peter Pan. He loved to see the children playing in the park he gave them. He loved the young because he, too, was young.

His city honoured him and he strove worthily to serve it in God's sight. We have lost a great and generous friend. I thank God for his childlikeness and that other outstanding quality he had of utter simplicity. He never spent his wealth on himself.

These tributes do not lay any too much stress on his love for Liverpool, which differed so markedly from the casual friendliness felt by most business men for their native city. In his inarticulate way he was a romanticist, and his imagination easily warmed towards whatever helped to revive memories of the past. One little thing he did in the service of local history: in 1931 he paid the cost of reprinting the 4th edition (1773) of Gore's Liverpool Directory.

The most widely placed and permanent memorial to George Audley will be this family history. It was at the end of 1924 that he began to feel he would like to know more about his ancestors, and got into touch with me. Though there was a family connexion between us (my father's brother had married his mother's sister) and we both belonged to Liverpool, we had never met before. I agreed to undertake enquiries, and to make a small charge for my services, as the subject was not one of personal concern to me, and the work rather interfered with my own special researches. He knew his family history as far back as his great grandfather, William Audley, and it is a confession good for my soul that after eight years or so of enquiry, during which most of the centralised evidences for the whole country were ransacked for evidence concerning anyone bearing the name of Audley, as well as an immense number of parish registers and other local records, not to mention all the ordinarily accessible printed sources, I was unable even to tell him that greatgrandfather's parentage! However, he soon became interested in the growing accumulation of Audleys, past and present, and fell in with my suggestion to print the results, despite his disappointment at being left without the means of connecting himself with any of the numerous lines of the family which I was able to show had flourished in many parts of the country down to the eighteenth century. I may record that he handed over to me during the seven years of our pleasant partnership in this: work a total sum of £920, which was increased by sales of Parts I. and II. to £934 odd. He left everything entirely in my hands, as to the researches undertaken, the printing of the two Parts, and my own charges I find that roughly my charges over the whole period amounted to £220, while the printing and drstribution of the two Parts cost some £240. The cost of searches, including fees, postages, stationery, and incidental charges of every kind, came to about £430 leaving a balance of £44l in hand towards the cost of printing-this Part III. The amount of work that has fallen upon me during all these years m the conduct of the searches, the sifting, sorting and arranging of the evidences, and the seeing of so much printed matter of the kind through the press, has been very heavy, but it has been a labour of love. Most of the searches in printed material have been made personally by me. Had George Audley lived he would have contributed further towards the completion of the work, but dying suddenly he was given no opportunity to make such provision as would have enabled me to carry it to a conclusion without being confronted by almost insuperable financial difficulties. It may be added that 300 copies each were printed of Parts I. and II., of which 247 were distributed free to libraries, including all the leading ones in the British Isles (public, university, society, club, etc.), and a comprehensive collection of similar ones throughout the Empire, the United States, and the principal countries of Europe. Rather more than a third of them have supported the continuation of the work by subscription.

For the memory of his parents George Audley had the greatest veneration, as well as for that of his grandfather, John Audley the shipbuilder, whose character and ability were an inspiration to him. He felt that such a grandfather, however humble his immediate origins may have been, carried the impress of a superior race (his portraits certainly suggest it), and he would have been delighted, though not from ordinarily snobbish motives, if his grandfather's descent could have been proved from some of those earlier Audleys whose

careers suggested the possession of qualities and capacities that are generally considered a valuable inheritance. But the characters and achievements of some "knights of old" would probably have ill compared with George Audley's unspectacular virtues and benefactions, which added new traditions, of a peculiarly human kind, to the history of the name he was so proud to bear.

PEDIGREE D THE ISSUE OF CHARLES AUDLEY WHO MARRIED SARAH MYLCRIST IN 1796

This can hardly be dignified by the description of a pedigree, for it only deals with two generations in the second of which no one is known to have married. Yet from the point of view of one seeking to relate the various Liverpool Audleys it is of considerable importance. All the evidence for it will be found among the general extracts, apart from that contained in the following death certificate:--1883. Wavertree, co. The significance of this piece of evidence is discussed elsewhere (ante, p. 258). According to Mr. Wakefield's pedigree (ante, p. 261), Elizabeth, the eldest daughter of Charles Audley, married ·Henry Edwards, of Castle Street, Liverpool, architect and surveyor, who built Audley Villa, Everton Road, in 1838, leaving it in 1849 for a house in Whitefield Road, which he called Audley House. They are said both to have died at Audley House before 1846, and to have had a son, Henry T; Edwards, who lived at Audley Villa from 1840 to 1870· One would accept this information, if it were not for Mr. Wakefield's incorrigible disregard for truth and accuracy.
