## The Baronage of England by William Dugdale Volume 2 Pages 382 to 383 (Published in 1675)

## Thomas Lord Audley of Walden

[30 Hen 8]

This document is a transcription of pages 382 & 383 of volume 2 'The Baronage of England by William Dugdale and published in 1675. The pages transcribed details the history of the Tuchet family who by marriage took over the title of Lord Audley. The aim of this transcription is to duplicate as far as possible the original document, however the following points should be taken into account when reading this document:

- Dates in the original document are written in 'Regnal format' e.g 16 H 3, the sixteenth year of the reign of Henry the third; and 9 R 2 the ninth year of the reign of Richard the second. These regnal dates have been left in the text wiith the date in modern format being included in brackets after the regnal date e.g 16 H 3 in modern format is 1232 and 9 R 2 in modern format is 1386. As the exact date in the original document is not specified I have assumed that the exact date was 1<sup>st</sup> June when transcribing regnal dates into modern formal.
- The original document used the symbol "f" to represent the letter "s" in this transcription the letter "s" has been used. For example the word also has been transcribed as also and likewife is transcribed as likewise.
- As far as possible we have kept the spelling in this transcription identical to that in the original
  document even though the same word has been spelt in a number of different ways in the
  original document.
- The references on the right hand side of the page were particularly difficult to transcribe. If you wish to use these references I would suggest that you check them against the original document. I would appreciate any help in relating the references to specific documents
- This document is the first draft of a of the original document. There are a number of checks required before it can be considered an accurate copy and before it can be re-written in modern English. If you are prepared to check the accuracy then please contact the website through the contact page of <a href="www.audleyfamilyhistory.com">www.audleyfamilyhistory.com</a> I do have an electronic copy of the original document. Please see the end for proposed steps to completing this document.

Of what Extraction this Thomas was, I have not seen: for, of the Family of the old Lords Audley, I suppose he was not; the Armes which he bore, being totally different from theirs: Nor have I observed any thing of him, till 18 H 8 (1526) that he became <sup>Z</sup> the Autumne- Reader in the Inner-Temple. Whereby it appears; that, having been a diligent Student of the Laws, he arrived to a great proficiency in the commendable Learning: in which within a short time after, he grew so famous that in 21 H 8 (1529) he was made choice of for Speaker b in the House of Commons in that Long-Parliament, which began upon the third of November in the same year; and continuing by Prorogation till 27 H 8 (1535) proved fatal to the Religious Houses, by the dissolution of all those whose Revenues were not certified to exceed the value of Two hundred pounds per annum In which his service was so acceptable to the King; as that, the next ensuing year (viz 22 H 8 (1530)) he was constituted <sup>c</sup> his Atturney for the Dutchy of Lancaster. Also, in Mich Terme. (Craft Mart) advances to the State and degree of Sergeant <sup>d</sup> at Law: and upon the fourteenth of November following made e the King's Serjeant. Nor was any farther Promotion thought to great for him: for, in 24 H 8 (1532) upon the Resignation f of that worthy Lord Chancellor, Sir Thomas Moore, he was <sup>g</sup> Knighted, and made <sup>h</sup> Lord Keeper of the Great Seal: and before the end of that year, Lord Chancellor of England.

Being therefore thus raised to that high place; discerning the Pope's Supremacy newly abolish'd whereupon the Title of Supreme Head on Earth of the Church of Englnd, was vested in the King; who conseuently took upon him, by his own absolute power to suppress <sup>1</sup> the Priory of Canons of the Holy Trinity, commonly called Christ-church near Algate, in the city of London; he obtain'd <sup>k</sup> the Scite and Precinct of the Religious House, and converted it to a fit Mansion for his own residence. Having likewise <sup>1</sup> all the Plate and Lands thereto belonging, bestowed on him. And, in 30 H 8 (1538) sate <sup>m</sup> High Steward upon the Arraignment of Henry Courtney Maruess of Exeter, then accused for Conspiring the advancement of Reginald Pole (afterwards Cardinal) to the Crown.

That this Thomas had been not a little instrumental, in carrying on that great design, for dissolving the lesser Monasteries, in that Parliament, wherin at first he was Speaker, none can doubt; his activeness fot obtaining the Surrender of the rest, being so conspicious; for I find, <sup>n</sup> that he imploy'd a special Agent to treat with the Abbot of Atheiny (in com Somerset) and to offer him an hundred Marks per annum pension, in case he would surrender; which the Abbot refused insisting on a greater sum: Also of that he personally dealt with the Abbot of St Osithes in Esser, to the like purpose; as by his Letter to the Visitor-general appeareth. Wherein he expressed, that he had by great sollicitation prevail'd with him; but withal, insinuated his desire; That his place of Lord Chancellor being very chargeable, the King might be moved, dor addition of some more prifitable Offices unto him. Nay it is evident, that hunting eagerly after that great Abby of Walden in Esser, ehich at length he obtain'd; as an argument the sooner to get it; besides <sup>p</sup> his extenuation of its worth he alleadg'd; That he bad in this world sustain'd great damge and infamy in serving the King, which the grant of that should recompence: and, that, being thus posesess'd thereof he was by Letters Patent bearing the date 29<sup>th</sup> November 30 H 8 (1538) created <sup>r</sup> Lord Audley of the same Walden, and to the heirs male of his Body; as also installed Knight s of the most noble Order of the Garter. But long he did not enjoy this cast Wealth and Honour: for having, by his Testament, <sup>t</sup> bearing the date 19 April An 1544 (35 H 8) bequeath'd his body to be buried in the Tombe of his new Chappel at Walden; and appointed that his Executors, should, upon the next New-Years day, after his decease, deliver a Legacie of One hundred pounds to the King, from whom (as his expression is) he had received all his Reputations and Benefits; he departed uthis life, this life, upon the last day of the same moneth, at his place of Christchurch (before-mention'd) and was buried

Leaving issue, <sup>x</sup> byElizabeth his wife, daughter <sup>y</sup> of Thomas Grey Marquess Dorset, two daughters; Margaret and Mary. Which Mary died unmarried as it seems: for Margaret became his sole <sup>Z</sup> heir; who first married <sup>a</sup> to the Lord Henry Dudley (a younger son to John Duke of Northumberland) slain at St uentind in Picardy in An 1557 (4 & 5 Ph % M) And afterwards to Thomas Duke of Norfolk (being his second wife) whose son by her, viz Thomas Earl of Suffolk (Lord Treasurer of England for almost six years in the time of King James) built upon the ruines of that Abby, that stately Fabrick at Walden, ,now known by the name of Audley-Enf. (in memory of this Lord Audley) not to be
