Who was the Audley in the list of people with the Audley surname who fought in WW1:

• Benjamin Audley

Royal Army Medical Corps Service No's #4142; #205184; #359408; #400302.

He should not be confused with {J6} Benjamin Audley of the Royal Garrison Artillery service number #131554

Unfortunately some service records did not survive. (Destroyed by fire in WW2). So is he?

He must have been alive at the time of the 1911 Census of England and the 1911 Census for England & Wales gives the following people with the above names:

- {J20} **Benjamin Audley** (1881 1963) aged 30 in 1911 living in Burnley
- {J6} **Benjamin Audley** (1885 1933) aged 25 in 1911 living in Burnley his service record survives
- {J18} **Benjamin Audley** (1857 1927)aged 53 living Burnley

There are no references in the 1911 Census of Ireland to a Benjamin Audley In our records we have no other appropriate references to a Benjamin Audley.

Discussion

Benjamin Audley

(Royal Army Medical Corps) Service No's #205184; #359408; #400302. (British Army, East Lancashire Regiment, Private, #4142

(The above person cannot be {J6} as the service record for {J6} survives and he was a member of a different Regiment.

It is unlikely that the above person would be {J18} as he would have been aged 56 to 60 years of age 1914-1918 and is therefore unlikely to have served in WW1.

It is therefore probable that the above person is {J20} but it is not certain.)

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
