Who were the people called H.M Audley and Henry Mark Audley in the list of people with the Audley surname who fought in WW1:

- H M Audley Royal Tank Regiment #7871902 & Guernsey Light Infantry #7376
- **Henry Mark Audley Duke of Cornwall' Light Infantry #5629**. A service record for this person exists and shows he was in the Duke of Cornwall's Light infantry from 1898.

Unfortunately some service records did not survive. (Destroyed by fire in WW2). So is he?

Possible candidates in the Audley Study is

- {QE34} Harold M Audley (1908 ????) born in Canada and too young to be a combatant in WW1.
- {B109} Henry Mark (Harry) Audley (1900 1960)
- {B122} Henry Mark Audley (1878 1963}

During WW1 the minimum and maximum age for conscription was 18 years and 41 years although this was increased to 51 in 1918.

Discuss

Henry Mark Audley Duke of Cornwall' Light Infantry #5629.

As this persons service record exists and shows he was in the regiment from 1898 {B122} is the only candidate for being this person.

Conclusion this person is {B122}

H M Audley Royal Tank Regiment #7871902 & Guernsey Light Infantry #7376

As there is no other alternative this person must be {B109}. Based on his date of Birth he would have seen very little service in WW1. His medal record card suggests that he did not receive any medals which also suggests that he saw very little service
